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1. Introduction

We are committed to eliminating acts of modern-day slavery and human trafficking within our business and from within our supply chains.

Our annual turnover is under £36 million and although we are not legally obliged to report on slavery and human trafficking, this statement is made in accordance with section 54(1) of the Modern Slavery Act 2015 and is our slavery and human trafficking statement for the financial year ending 30 April 2027.

2. Organisational Structure, Business and Supply Chains

Qubit Interior Solutions Ltd supply chain consists of suppliers of building materials, interior finishes, and furniture, specialist sub-contractors for installation and trades, logistics and storage partners, and professional service providers. We are committed to ensuring that all partners in our supply chain operate ethically, comply with applicable laws, and uphold standards on labour rights and human rights.

Qubit Interior Solutions Ltd operates from a single unit, which includes our head office and operational facilities. Our supply chain consists entirely of UK-based wholesale or retail suppliers providing building materials, interior finishes, furniture components, packaging materials, installation tools, and office supplies. None of our materials or supplies are sourced directly from manufacturers.

3. Policy on Slavery and Human Trafficking



We are committed to ensuring that there is no modern slavery or human trafficking in any part of our business or in our supply chains. This policy reflects our commitment to acting ethically and with integrity in all our business relationships and to implementing and enforcing effective systems and controls to ensure slavery and human trafficking is not taking place anywhere within our supply chains.

We ensure that all suppliers we use are made aware of our policy and comply with equally high standards.

4. Due Diligence

We consider ourselves to be a 'low risk' business with regard to slavery and human trafficking. However, we foster a culture that encourages the identification and reporting of any such risks within our business. We recruit all our employees either directly or through recruitment agencies who are members of the Recruitment and Employment Confederation. We do not recruit from outside the UK.

5. Assessing and Managing Risk

As a business we regularly evaluate the level and nature of any risks of modern slavery or exploitation, in both our own practices and those of our supply chain. We have a whistleblowing policy in place and, as part of our efforts to identify and mitigate risks within our supply chain, we are introducing systems to identify, assess and monitor potential risk areas.

6. Effectiveness in Combating Slavery and Human Trafficking

We have zero tolerance to slavery and human trafficking. To ensure that all those in our supply chains comply with our values we are putting in place a supply chain compliance programme that will require our suppliers to confirm that they have a slavery and human trafficking policy in place and that they require the same from their suppliers.

7. Training

We are providing appropriate training to ensure that relevant employees understand the risks of modern slavery and human trafficking within our business and supply chains.
